
# The Story of Afterschool

She currently is the Executive Director of Kids Kan Inc., an organization that specializes in staff development, activity selection and program implementation. Gale has served as an adjunct professor for several universities. Her Ed.D. in Curriculum and Instruction focused on academic intervention in after school programs and her Ed.S. is in School Psychology. She effectively models teaching that accommodates for all student's ability levels and reflects a keen awareness of child and adolescent development and brain-based learning principles. ## KEYNOTE Speaker: Manny Scott

An original Freedom Writer whose story is told in part in the 2007 hit movie, Freedom Writers, Manny Scott has energized almost



two million leaders, educators, volunteers, and students worldwide with his authentic, inspiring messages of hope. On the road up to 300 days per year for the last two decades, Manny Scott is on a mission.

By age 16, Manny's story was almost over: His father was incarcerated, he missed 60-90 days of school annually from 4th to 9th grade, he dropped out of school at age 14, he lived in 26 places by age 16, and his best friend was brutally murdered. Sensing that the end of his life was near, Manny sat down on a park bench, and considered how he would make others feel the depth of despair and anger roiling in his soul. He says, "When I look back, I now see that I was heading down a path that would have destroyed me."

Then, several individuals entered his life and helped him turn the page. He returned to school and ended up in the back of Erin Gruwell's English class —a group now known worldwide as the Freedom Writers, portrayed in the 2007 hit MTV movie. She and several others helped Manny go from Fs and Ds to As and Bs. They helped him become the first person in his family to graduate from high school and go to college.

Through very hard work, and with the help of others, Manny is now living the life of his dreams. In 2007, he founded Ink International, Inc, an education consulting firm that has empowered nearly two million people to improve the quality of not only their own lives, but also the lives of those around them.

He has helped hundreds of organizations raise student achievement and leader effectiveness in 49 states and five continents; and, he has helped prevent thousands of dropouts and suicides.

He is now happily married, a doting father of three, a pilot, a Ph.D. student, and one of the nation's most sought-after speakers.




### Featured speaker: Erika Petrelli

### **Using Agriculture to Teach STEM**

Heather Fletcher and Daniel Savage

(Marbella B)

The Agriculture Education on the Move™ (AEOTM) program is a hands-on STEM program based in agriculture, Missouri's leading industry. While AEOTM is designed primarily for third graders, it aligns with more than 30 Missouri Learning Standards in grades 2-5. In the most recent evaluation of the program, 96% of students showed improvement in knowledge from pre to post tests. Additionally, 100% of teachers agreed that students were engaged in the AEOTM lessons, and that the curriculum supported learning science content. The majority of teachers also reported that students were interested in careers presented in the AEOTM program.





Program directors, particularly those at fee-for-service programs, are already stressing about their 2022-23 budgets. In this small group discussion space, program administrators will share their challenges with preparing a budget with fewer fulltime staff, cuts to other expenses (sibling discounts, reduced hours, etc.), and the ongoing Covid situation (refunds when programs are closed, parents unable to afford co-pays). Table conversations may include staffing, burnout, waitlists, closed sites, etc. Please come prepared with your current (2021-22) and projected (2022-23) budgets and staff salary schedule so that a shared Google Doc can be created based on this information.
