The year was 2002. The United States hosted the Winter Olympics. Former President Jimmy Carter was awarded the Nobel Peace Prize. President George W. Bush signed the No Child Left Behind Act into law. A 2-liter bottle of Coca-Cola cost 99 cents. In pop culture, American Idol debuted, Eminem released the single "Lose Yourself", and Halle Berry became the first black woman to win an Oscar for Best Actress.

In other big news from 2002, the Missouri AfterSchool Network (MASN) was created.

Missouri was one of eight states to receive the first round of funding from the Charles Stewart Mott Foundation for a statewide afterschool network. That first grant, given for a period of three years, helped lay the foundation for what MASN would become.

Twenty years have now passed and MASN has continued to expand and evolve. Starting in 2002 with only two consultants doing the work, MASN hired its first full time staff person in 2006 and has now grown to 18 staff and consultants working on afterschool partnerships, policy, and quality across the state. Happy 20th birthday, MASN!!

Our conference theme this year, *There's No Place Like Afterschool,* came out of the MASN 20-year anniversary. An emerald can be given as a 20-year anniversary gift, which led us to the Emerald City, which led us to *There's No Place Like Afterschool*.

Afterschool is such a unique environment. Where else can a child get a snack, get help with homework, have a guitar lesson, learn how to build a model of a windmill, and hang out with friends all in one day?!?! In afterschool settings, we have the opportunity to enhance what children are already learning in school or at home while also offering enrichments that are not typically found at school or at home. 




